Public Meeting Scheduled for Arapahoe Road Corridor Study Improvement Options Identified in First Phase of Project

Arapahoe County, CO — Members of the community interested in improving Arapahoe Road from I-25 to Parker Road are invited to give input on initial improvement options and learn about potential for growth and land use along the corridor. The Arapahoe Road Corridor Study will hold its second public meeting on June 1st at the Arapahoe Library District Support Services Building (12855 E. Adam Aircraft Circle). The meeting will be an open house from 5 to 7:30 p.m. There will be no formal presentation.

The Arapahoe Road Corridor Study, which began last November, is an 18-month study to examine alternatives for improving mobility, accessibility and safety while balancing local community needs along Arapahoe Road. The study considers all modes of transportation in this travel corridor, including mass transit, pedestrian and bicycle traffic.

At the public meeting, a team led by the engineering firm David Evans & Associates, Inc. will display their findings from the first phase of the study, including a land use and market study analysis, traffic data collection and operational analysis. Input received to date from regional agencies, local governments, corridor businesses, community residents and corridor commuters regarding transportation needs from I-25 to Parker Road, and between I-225 on the north and E-470 on the south will be summarized for public review.

“At the public meeting, you will see a menu of improvement options that have been suggested for consideration by the public and local agencies, including ideas for rebuilding the I-25 interchange, improving intersections, parallel and intersecting roads, and public transit or alternative modes of transportation” said Bryan Weimer, Capital Improvements Program Manager in Arapahoe County’s Engineering Division.

“We encourage community members to attend and provide comments on the initial improvement options and evaluation criteria, and to learn about the next steps in the study,” said Joe Hart, project manager with David Evans & Associates, Inc.
