What is a Transportation Plan, and how will it fit into the County's Comprehensive Master Plan?

The Arapahoe County 2035 Transportation Plan will become an element of the overall Comprehensive Master Plan. The Transportation Plan will serve as a strategic plan to provide vision to decision-makers in developing a countywide transportation system. The Plan will guide short-term and long-term decisions for transportation maintenance, Capital Improvement Projects and development requirements.

Why is the focus of this plan on unincorporated Arapahoe County?

The incorporated jurisdictions within the County each have their own transportation and master plans in place. During the development of this Plan, coordination will occur with incorporated municipalities within and surrounding the County to ensure a comprehensive transportation system is provided.

How was the 2035 planning horizon chosen?

The long-term planning horizon of 2035 was chosen to be consistent with the current DRCOG Regional Transportation Plan. Transportation system needs and improvements for an interim year of 2020 will be analyzed to develop a 10-year Capital Improvement Program. Land use forecasts for a High Growth scenario will also be assessed to determine the potential impacts to transportation system recommendations.

Who develops the Transportation Plan?

Arapahoe County competitively selected David Evans and Associates, Inc. to conduct research, gather public input, analyze alternatives, create recommendations and produce the 2035 Transportation Plan. This will be done with extensive involvement from representatives of various Arapahoe County department technical staff.

What kinds of public and agency involvement are taking place?
